Your invitation and ticket in the "Art Union" will be mailed with this Newsletter - one ticket only per member this year but your chance of a prize is the same as before. "VARNISHING" Day for exhibiting artists will be on FRIDAY, 26th at 5 p.m. The Exhibition remains open until SUNDAY, APRIL 18TH.
