#### Hohepa Homes & Schools

The New Zealand Trust Board for Home Schools for Curative Education was formed in Napier in 1957 to establish and maintain homes, schools, farms, and workshops in New Zealand for mentally retarded children and adults. The name "Hohepa" was chosen—a Maori word meaning "Joseph". The biblical significance of this name makes it a happy choice as a title for these homes.

The work in the Hohepa Homes and Schools is founded on the philosophy, and teaching methods, propounded by the late Rudolf Steiner, Ph.D., and is also used extensively in most Western Countries. Those who apply these methods have the conviction that the mentally retarded child, and adult, is worth educating, training, and caring for.

In New Zealand the Homes are well established in both Napier and Christchurch. The Trust Board is now in receipt of certain Government assistance and subsidies, but there remains much to be done from funds which have to be found from other sources.

In Christchurch the first Home — the Hohepa Grace and Shirley Home — was opened in 1965 at 141 Hackthorne Road. A few years later the Birchfield property at 23 Barrington Street was purchased, giving us a School House and enabling us to expand further with the building of two family homes. The aim now of the Trust Board, and those people associated with the Christchurch Hohepa, is the building of a Workshop, and training complex, together with another family home on this Barrington Street site — hence this fund raising effort.

In every hundred children born in New Zealand, one at least is mentally retarded to a greater or lesser degree. In any family the odds of having such a child are greater than we like to admit, so that few people are likely to proclaim "It can't happen to me." With a growing population, there is an ever increasing number of these children to be cared for. Undertaking the responsibility of doing this, and of teaching them, opens up a great field for understanding, study and research into their needs. The family, the community, and the nation must accept these responsibilities. The "Hohepas" are determined to do everything they can to assist people and their families both now and in the future.
