Opening night sales procedure

THERE WILL BE NO SALES UNTIL AFTER THE FORMAL OPENING

Sales attendants wearing coloured sashes will be stationed in the gallery near the pieces for which they are responsible. They have a numbered sales card for each of these pieces.

An intending purchaser should collect the sales card bearing the number of the item being purchased and the sales attendant will mark the piece with a red sticker.

This card MUST be presented at the Sales Desk before 9 pm, for the purchaser's name and address to be recorded and a minimum deposit of 10% received. A receipt will be issued and must be presented when the piece is collected.

The balance owing must be paid, at the exhibition, not later than 4pm, Thursday 23rd August.

Purchased pieces are to be collected from the gallery on Thursday 23rd August, from 10am-4.30pm.

The receipt issued on opening night must be presented when the piece is collected.

Sales procedure from Wednesday 15th August

10% deposit is required and a receipt will be issued. The balance of payment should be made not later than collection day, Thursday 23rd August. The receipt must be presented when the pot is collected.

About the guest exhibitors

Sandra Black, Selector and Guest Exhibitor

Our Selector for the 1990 C.P.A. Exhibition "Colour the Nineties", lives and works in South Fremantle, W.A.; trained as a teacher and later gained an Associateship in Art Teaching from the Western Australian Institute of Technology in 1975. Sandra has since undertaken many artist-in-residencies and lectures on her work. She has participated in eighty-seven exhibitions and is represented in thirty-four Australian and New Zealand State and regional galleries and institutional collections.

Commenting on her work she states:

"Colour in my work provides a contrast to the other decorative techniques that I use. I find it provides a release from the tedium of carving and piercing and the intense emotional involvement of the draped vessels. For many years I was nervous about using the brush, but a friendship with a woman painter, Wendy Stavrianos, and her encouragement of my earlier fumbling attempts led me on to develop the courage to continue. I find an ease and relaxation now in the application of colour and keep looking for further developments in this area.

Sandra Black's participation was assisted by State Government of W.A. through the Department for the Arts.

Vic Evans, Guest Exhibitor

Born in Dunedin, but now lives and works at Wakefield, Nelson. Vic first became involved in pottery in 1975 after training as a teacher, and teaching art 1975-79. From 1985-1990 he has had work accepted for eleven major exhibitions. A former member of the C.P.A. (1973-1976) he first exhibited in our Annual Exhibition.

He comments on his more recent efforts:
"My work over recent years has been concerned with the figure and its relationship to the pottery vessel form. This is an area of ceramics that has interested potters for thousands of years.

1990 saw a change of direction as the result of attending a ceremony for a young Maori who had died in an accident. The ceremony was held on Tahuna Beach on a cold windy day. During the ceremony the Waka that had been constructed by the tribes of the northern South Island was paddled into Nelson haven. The symbolism of this scene encouraged me to move my work towards another "vessel" form; the vessel as a boat. The boat has often been representative of many ideas to different cultures and it is this symbolism I am exploring with my most recent work. However, as a potter, the vessel in its role as a container will always represent a major source of inspiration.

John Green, Guest Exhibitor.

John started in clay in 1976, but had a brief foray earlier at the age of eight. He has been involved in eleven one man exhibitions, six "guestings" and frequently exhibits in group shows.

He now works in the new Fairy Studios in Anawhata Place, Auckland West.

In the artist's own words:

"Out of Fairy Studios comes, (apart from some high detail ink-line, colour drawings, wordology, poems and occasional altered thrownware) dancing dogs, human animals, dirty rats, fairies, (some fly) sassy hippos, rock 'n roll moles, sweetbirds, unicorns, wizardwizards ... pirates, some clowns, jesters, dancing pigs (in naughties) more dogs cos I've got one, and anything else (some fly) and music."
